  - Uber from DIA to AirBNB
    - Check-in is at 10am
    - ~30 mins away from Fisherman's Wharf

  - Chill evening; get settled into AirBNB, go out for drinks, etc.

- <u>Pearl's Deluxe Burgers</u>: highest-rated burger in SF; \$ \*
- St. Francis Fountain: oldest diner in SF; great brunch spot; \$
- Yo Yo's; Japanese; noodles, sushi; \$
- La Taqueria: highest-rated Mexican food in SF; \$
- Kusina Ni Tess: authentic Filipino steam tables; breakfast all day; \$
- Om Sabor: authentic vegan Mexican food; \$
  - Shares space with **Phonobar**: a high-end bar & dance floor
- Eddie's Cafe: cute breakfast spot with bottomless coffee; \$ \*
- Marnee Thai: the owners cooked for the royal family of Thailand!
- Norman's Ice Cream & Freezes: on Fisherman's Wharf; \$
- In 'N Out; definitely overhyped, but still worth a visit; \$ \*
- Ghirardelli Chocolate Factory; get the ice cream!!!! \$\$ \*
- <u>La Cocina's Municipal Marketplace</u>: food hall with several restaurants to choose from; \$\$
  - Fluid Cafe: trans-owned cafe & event space; \$
  - <u>La Paloma</u>: women-owned bar; \$\$
- Prubechu: SF's only Guamanian restaurant; egg noodles, pork ribs, ceviche; \$\$
- The Franciscan; a close second to Poggio! You can get a booth that overlooks the ocean and Alcatraz; \$\$ \*
- Mymy Coffee Shop: great breakfast/brunch spot; \$\$
- China Live; "massive Chinese food emporium," with a cold drinks bar upstairs; \$\$
- Lucca Delicatessen; old-school deli; one of SF's top restaurants; \$\$ \*
- Mandalay Restaurant; super unique & highly-rated Burmese food; \$\$
- Breadbelly; Asian/American-owned bakery; \$\$
- PPQ Dungeness Island; Vietnamese-style roast crab; good pasta; \$\$
- Lombardi's: deli and BBQ in Petaluma; \$\$ \*
- Mama Ji's: highest-rated Chinese food in SF; \$\$
- <u>SF ChickenBox</u>: one of the top fried chicken spots; \$\$
- <u>Front Porch</u>: one of the best places for southern food; fried chicken; \$\$

- Za Pizza: one of the highest-rated pizza places for a good price; \$\$
- My favorite restaurant of all time, the greatest food that I've ever eaten: <u>Poggio</u>!!!
   In Sausalito, so you'll probably want to Uber; \$\$\$ \*
- <u>Wayfare Tavern</u>: slightly fancier; traditional American; has some highly-rated chicken and deviled eggs; \$\$\$
- Cotogna; very reputable Italian food, but more casual; \$\$\$
- Kokkari Estiatorio; Greek tavern; \$\$\$
- Waterbar: one of the highest-rated seafood restaurants; \$\$\$

- Smuggler's Cove: in the top 50 bars of the whole world; very exotic cocktails; \$\$
- El Techo: rooftop bar/patio; happy hour 4-6pm; \$\$
- The Page: more dive-bar-esque, but has good ratings; \$
- Dirty Habit: really nice area & rooftop bar, but no ocean views; \$\$
- <u>620 Jones</u>: Amazing atmosphere & drinks; again, has a rooftop with no ocean view; but still nice! \$\$
- OneUp Lounge in the Grand Hyatt: amazing rooftop views; their website says
  open to both locals and guests, but I'll call them to double check; \$\$
- Vesuvio Bar: right nextdoor to City Lights bookstore!
- Humphry Slocombe: boozy ice cream! \$\$
